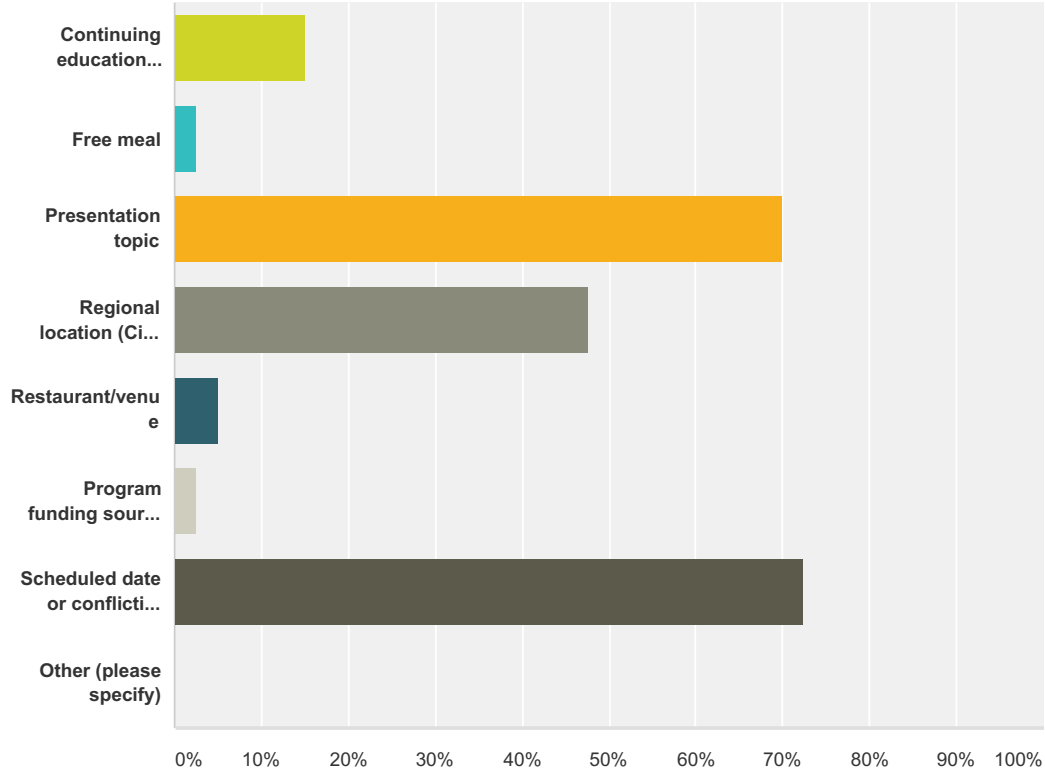

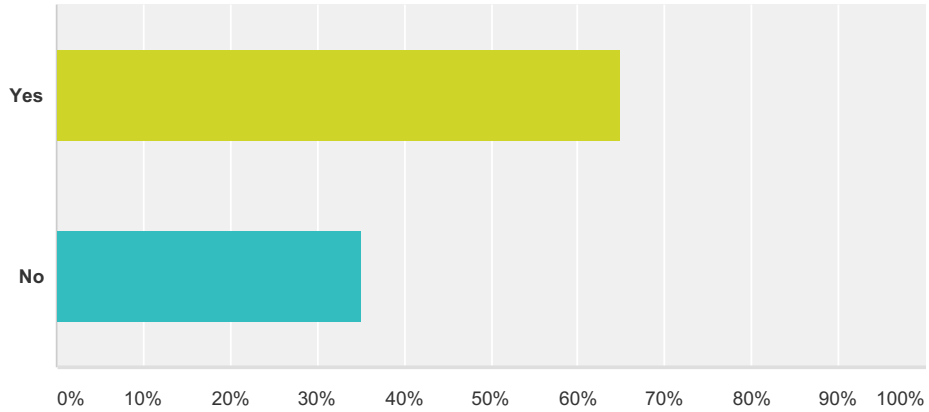

Q12 Would you remotely participate in meetings if GPC-ONS offered remote access to meetings (webinar, Skype)?

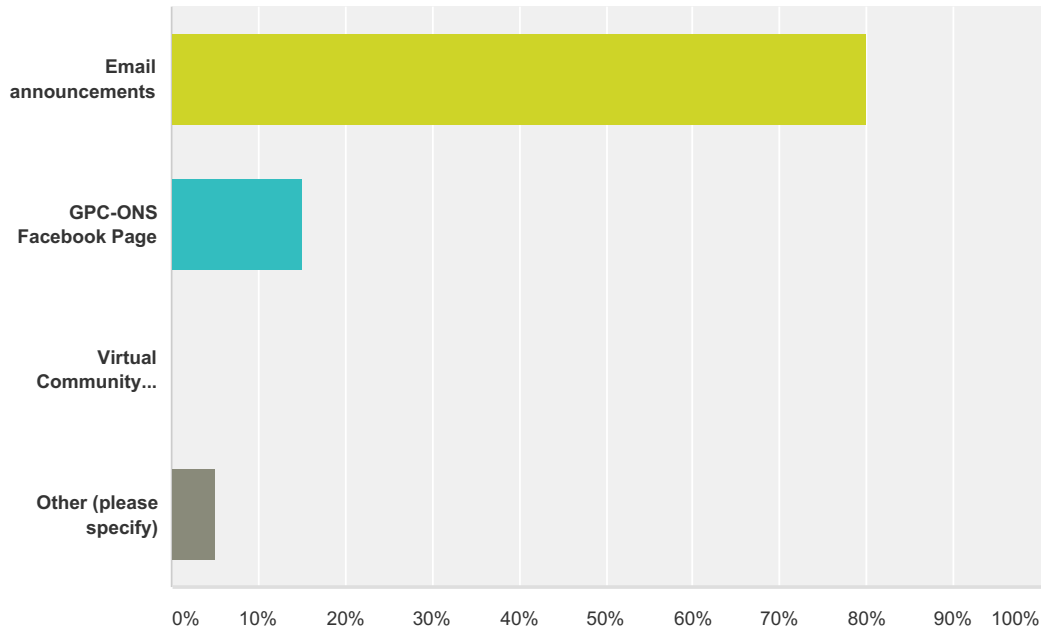

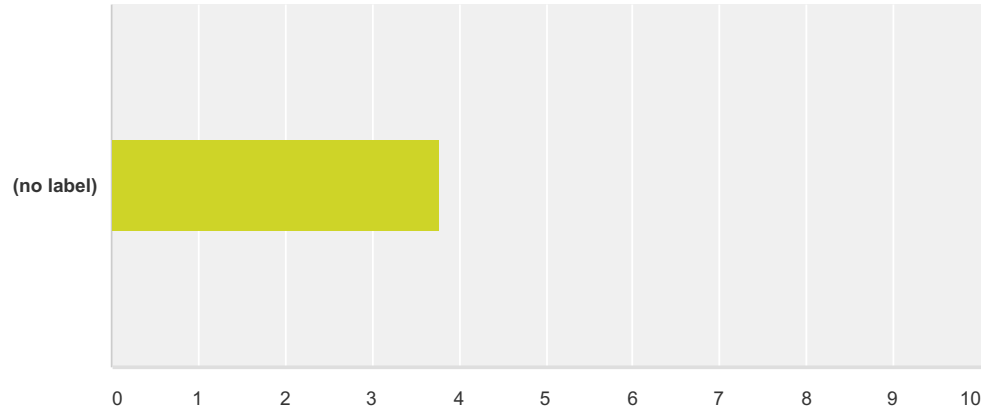

Q14 How important is obtaining continuing education credit at monthly GPC-ONS meetings?

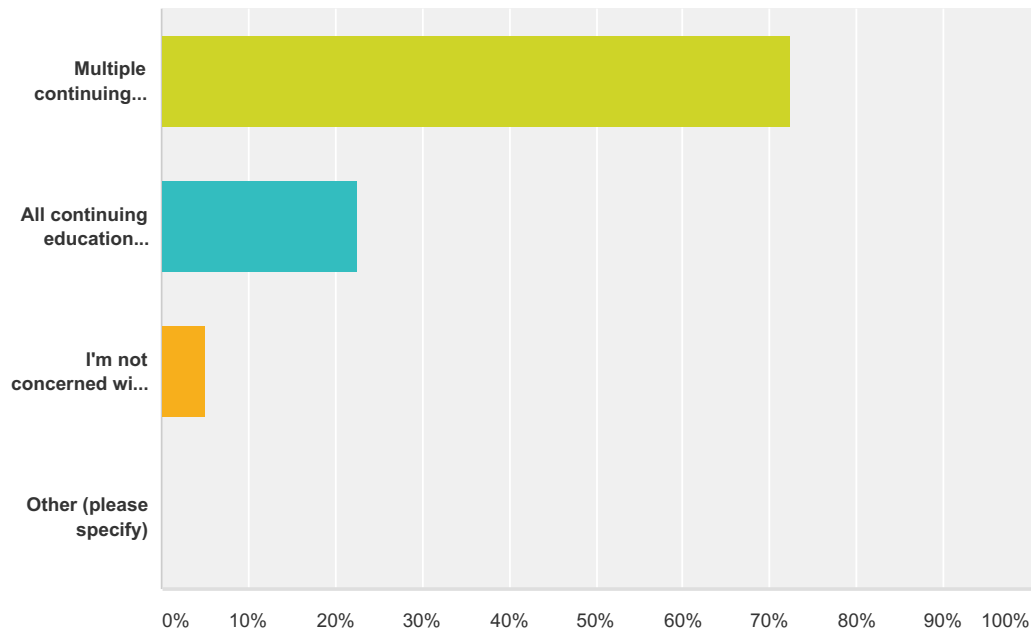

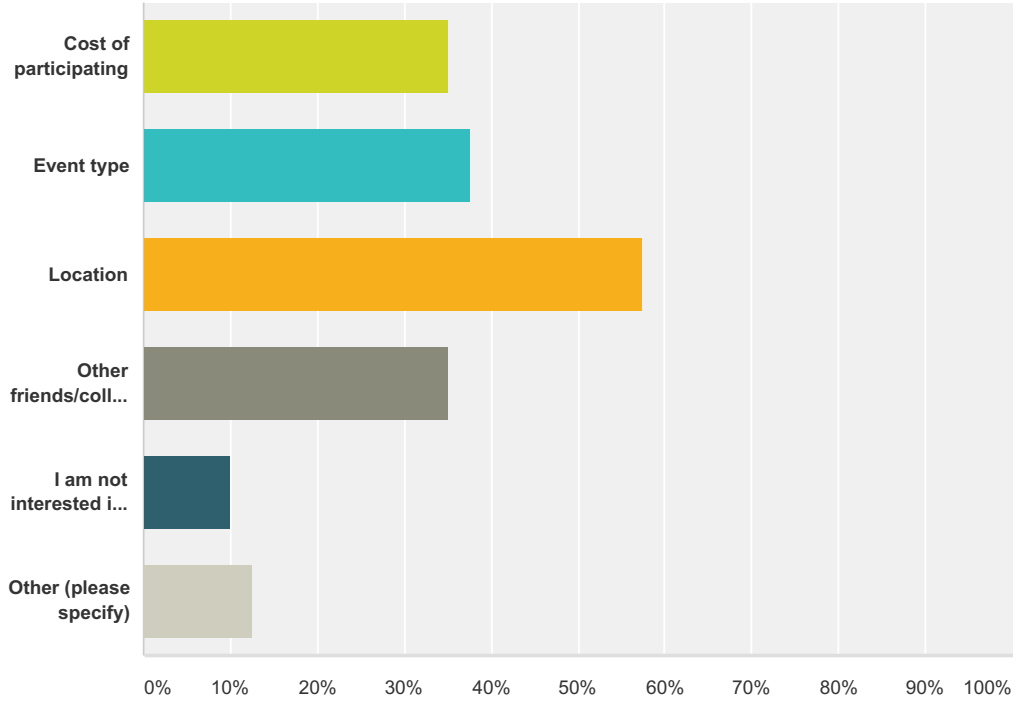
